RULES AND REGULATIONS

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE MARSHALL & STERLING LEAGUE OR THE EASTERN CHAPTER OF THE PENNSYLVANIA PROFESSIONAL HORSEMEN'S ASSOCIATION WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

1. Time Schedule: The time schedule and order of events herein is tentative. The Show Office will post the official starting times, changes in scheduling and revisions. Exhibitors are responsible for having entries at the ring 30 minutes before class time. No class will be delayed more than 3 minutes. Exhibitors must request Ring Master to adjust for conflicts.
2. Entries: Entries for Hunter, Equitation and Jumper Sections close on August 14, 2011. Entries postmarked or digitally stamped (for emailed entries) after midnight, Monday August 15, 2011 will be considered post-entries and entry fees will be increased accordingly. All entries will be charged a \$10.00 (non-refundable/non-transferable) Office Fee. No faxed entries will be accepted. Entries must be accompanied by a check in the amount of the total fee or a blank check. Entries submitted through email must pay via PayPal on our website calendar at www.berksequinecouncil.org and *must forward a copy of their payment confirmation* to BECHorseShow@gmail.com.
3. Complete entry blank enclosed, including all signatures required. ONE HORSE PER ENTRY BLANK. Additional entry blanks may be obtained by calling 484-955-2574, emailing BECHorseShow@gmail.com or visiting www.berksequinecouncil.org.
4. Misprints in the prize list are unintentional and every effort is made to minimize them. If any misunderstanding arises from a misprint, the management will make every effort to clarify the situation. Management decisions are final in regards to a prize list misprint.
5. Should any question or dispute arise that is not provided for in the rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Management whose decision shall be final.
6. Every horse entered will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show, the Berks Equine Council, the Reading Fair, or the Berks County 4-H, its directors and employees, and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.
7. The management reserves the right to interpret all questions regarding the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.
8. Show Management reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes and/or change the location of the class if necessary.
9. **Formal attire is REQUIRED** for classes 81 through 91. Show Management reserves the right to prohibit an exhibitor's competing in any or all of these classes if he or she is not in formal attire.
10. All hunter classes will be judged on performance, manners, soundness and way of going. A dotted line may be used in all classes. All ties in jumper classes other than first place will share the prize money or placing. Jump orders will be established in all Jumper classics one hour prior to the class and posted at the ingate. All other classes will have jump order at the management's discretion.
11. Berks Equine Council Members receive a discount on the entry fee of one class, as follows: \$5.00 on classes No. 1-80; \$10 on classes 81 through 91.
12. Horses shown in classes in which they have not been entered will be required to pay DOUBLE ENTRY FEE in those classes.
13. All entries must be paid in full before numbers are issued. Scratches and post entries will be accepted if made at least two classes in advance.
14. SCRATCHES: Please take care of "Class Adds" and "Class Scratches" at least one hour before the start of the division. A form will be available at the Horse Show Office.

15. Scratches before the start of the show shall be accepted and a \$50 office fee and a \$25 scratch fee will be deducted. After the start of the show scratches will be accepted upon receipt of a vet certificate after the office fee and scratch fee have been deducted. If the entry fee is by division only, no can be refunded after the start of the division. **Stall fees are never refundable.**
16. A vet may be consulted to decide soundness of a horse in the Hunter Classes. The decision of the Judge is final.
17. All classes for Juniors are limited to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1, 2010.
18. No pony shall be shown in a Pony Class or Division unless owner presents a valid USEF measurement card (permanent or temporary) or pony measures no more than 14.2 hands, as determined by Show Management.
19. Should there be less than 10 entries in any classic or class with over \$500 in prize money, management reserves the right to reduce the prize money and run the class.
20. Schooling permitted in designated schooling areas only.
21. Flatwork will be allowed in the rings each morning.
22. Poling: Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo pole offsets are prohibited. Any rider or trainer who is found poling or using offsets, as well as the horse or pony involved, will be immediately eliminated from the class where the incident occurred, be suspended from further showing and will forfeit all entry fees. Further, any rider or trainer found, in the opinion of the judges or committee, to be using their whip or spurs in an excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class where the incident occurred, be suspended from further showing for a 24 hour period, and will forfeit entries for that class.
23. In the event of a tie, there will be a jump off for first place only. All other ties will be broken by the time faults in the first round unless otherwise specified.
24. Fees: Payment of all fees must be made in U.S. funds. A penalty of \$25.00 will be charged for all non-negotiable funds.
25. Office/Admin Fee: The non-refundable/non-transferable office fee includes the following: equine ambulance and attendants, Emergency Medical Professionals and entry processing.
26. Prize Money. ***All riders must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money.*** All prize money will be paid through the show office. All prize monies in excess of balance due will be paid to the owner of record at the Secretary's Stand or mailed to the owner of record, unless otherwise directed, within 30 days after completion of the show. Every exhibitor must furnish his/her social security or Federal I.D. number or be subject to IRS withholding of 30%. Please allow one half hour for processing results before checking out.
27. The Berks Equine Council reserves the right to cancel, combine, or otherwise alter classes as entries dictate. The decision of judge/timer is final.
28. Management reserves the right to combine Divisions (as indicated throughout this prize list) due to number of entries.
29. Six ribbons will be awarded in each class; Champion and Reserve ribbons in each division. Champions also receive a prize. Trophy donated by BERKS EQUINE COUNCIL awarded to winner of Mini Prix; cooler, saddle pad and other prizes donated by various Show Sponsors.
Show Management has the right to substitute any or all of the non-monetary prizes listed in this publication at any time leading up to the start of the Horse Show.
30. Current negative Coggins test required. The State of Pennsylvania requires that all horses must be in possession of a negative Coggins Certificate (E.I.A.). The State of Pennsylvania requirement is a 12 month period. The Berks Equine Council Horse Show will not accept or process any animal whose negative Coggins Certificate, or copy thereof (issued after August 21, 2010) does not accompany the entry blank.
31. ASTM-SEI helmets with harnesses required for all; safety vests recommended for jumper classes.
32. Fence heights are approximate.
33. Refreshments available on the grounds; all dogs must be leashed.
34. The Berks Equine Council, Berks County 4-H, Reading Fair, their volunteers and employees will not be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horse/pony, or property of exhibitor or spectator incurred on or off the show grounds.

35. Classes No. 81 through 91 will have the order of go established in reverse order of entries received, with pre-entries having priority. The jump order will be posted at the Secretary Stand and at the in-gate no later than 30 minutes before the class begins. Where relevant, ties except for first are decided by the best time in the first round. Ties for first are jumped off in Table II.2(a) and II.2(b).
36. STABLING: Management will be providing overnight stabling on the showgrounds for exhibitors requiring overnight stabling. **If you will require overnight stabling, please notify the Show Manager and Secretary by emailing BECHorseShow@gmail.com by midnight Wednesday, July 20, 2011 with the number of stalls and dates requested.** Management will notify anyone requiring overnight stabling the price of stabling.
37. Temporary stalls with permanent doors under a permanent building will be available. Stalls will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. **Stall fees -- \$150/weekend, non refundable. No day stalls available. If enough exhibitors reserve stabling at this show in order to reduce the rental fee per unit, the horse show will mail a refund to exhibitors who stable at this show.**
38. Shavings, feed and hay orders may be made at the stabling office.
39. No animals other than horses will be allowed to overnight in stalls without the express permission of the management. If animals are found in trailers they will be considered abandoned and the authorities will be called to rescue them.
40. All dogs must be on leashes on the showgrounds.

Nominating Fee

All horses showing in Level 4, 5 and 6 (Puissance, Open Speed and Mini Prix) jumpers must be nominated and pay the nominating fee of \$50.00 by the closing date of entries for each show. Horses showing in jumper sections not requiring a nominating fee will pay the per class fee only and should enter their classes when submitting their entry blank or they must pay post entry fee. Once a horse is nominated the post entry fee is NOT refundable for any reason. No Nominating Fee: Levels 1, 2, 3, 4, Adult Amateurs, Children's, and Pony Jumpers will not have a nominating fee. Late Nominating: Horses not nominated by the closing date for the show will pay \$75/per horse for a nominating fee. Poling: Poling Will Not be allowed on the grounds at any time. Ties: All ties involving first place will be jumped off. Ties not involving first place will be decided upon time unless otherwise stated. Courses: Courses may consist of any combination of the following; brush, gates, oxers, post and rails, water, Liverpool, ditch, wall, banks, panels, or coops.

A LITTLE MORE ABOUT YOUR HOST, THE BERKS EQUINE COUNCIL

Like many non-profit organizations, the Berks Equine Council started as an idea. An idea posed to unite and support the equine community of Berks County.

Originally known as “Berks Equine Incentives”, the group was composed of 6 individuals, including Honorary Chairman & County Commissioner, Judy Schwank, who gathered together in 2003 to fulfill a vision.

At that time, their goals were to maintain the beauty that is Berks County through horses and the business they generate. Furthermore, this group was also dedicated to the concept of harnessing the collective energy of fellow “horse” enthusiasts for the purpose of enhancing and renewing equine activities in Berks County.

In 2004, the organization was re-named the Berks Equine Council. Since that time, the BEC has continued to evolve to meet the needs of the equine community. The BEC is a membership organization that is open to equine enthusiasts and professionals who practice all disciplines and ride all breeds of horses.

At the end of 2009, the organization created a strategic plan and modified its mission statement. It states, **“The Berks Equine Council is a non-profit membership organization that serves as an educational resource and promotes activities for local equine enthusiasts and professionals, thus enhancing the quality of life of Berks County.”**

Each year, the Berks Equine Council hosts multiple educational seminars and clinics, a member picnic & trail ride, as well as our annual Hunter/Jumper Show, Judged Trail Ride and Denim & Dancing fundraiser.

The BEC also publishes a directory of equine services to assist horse owners in Berks County with where they can get the services and goods they need for their operation.

Entry Fee: \$10 Pre-entry; \$15 Post-entry. Ribbons for First through Tenth Place & Honorable Mentions

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER DIVISION

Open to children who have not reached their 10th birthday as of December 1st, 2010. Judged on soundness, manners and way of going. All classes to be judged equally on hands, seat, legs, control of mount and suitability. Riders may cross enter in the Pleasure Division only. Fences not to exceed 18".

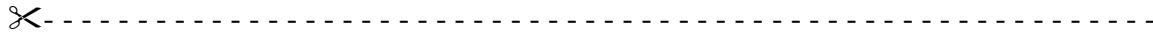

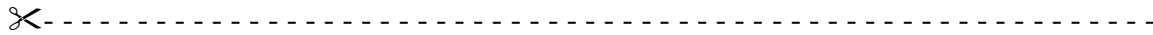
